The Three Steps

It happens in personal interactions, on television, and, especially, on social media. It sells movies, video games, and brings media attention to tweets. It is infectious and addictive. I am talking about the increase in viciousness,

violence, and injustice across all platforms of our interactions. The rise in incidents of anti-Semitism, racism, and other isms in our schools, our community, and our nation are just the tip of an iceberg reflecting a breakdown in the social contact of decency upon which the American family and Jewish community depends.

The good news? There is something we can do to push back against this addiction. I am not talking about barring violent video games from your homes or deleting harsh Facebook comments, though both are good ideas. I am talking about a three step program created by the Jewish Sage Hillel, who lived at a divisive time surprisingly like our own.

Here are Hillel's three steps:

Step One: "*If I am not for myself, who will be?*" According to Leviticus 19:18, we are *to love our neighbors as ourselves*. As ourselves. Not more than ourselves. We need not erase our uniqueness to blend in or remain silent about our own needs and concerns. For how can someone else understand what pains us if we do not share what we feel? It takes courage to share our stories, fears, pain and anger without reactivity, blame or judgment so others can hear our concerns.

But it isn't enough to stand up for oneself. Hillel added a second step: *If I am only for myself, what am I?* It also takes courage to listen with a compassionate, rather than a judgmental or defensive, heart as others share their stories, fears, pain and anger with us. Each of us has an unalienable right, endowed by our Creator to be treated justly, with dignity, as part of the same human family. What hurts one of us, hurts us all. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, responsible for their wellbeing, as well as our own.

These two steps lead to Hillel's third step: *And if not now, when?* Now is the time to apply these steps in our personal and collective lives. This three step program works. I know because I have seen it work in building relationships across differences in our second annual Courageous Conversations this spring that Beth Shalom helped lead. Imagine how our own family lives might change if we approached our loved ones in this three step way. Imagine what a difference we,

collectively, can make in our community by engaging courageously in informal conversations with even a handful of family, co-workers, friends, and neighbors. Over the next few weeks we will be counting the Omer as symbolic steps toward accepting the Torah on Shavuot, June 8-10. Hillel understood love thy neighbor as yourself as the Torah's most important value. His three steps can help us live that value more fully through the lives we touch. Let me know how it goes. In the meantime, may you and yours have a happy Shavuot.

It's hard to believe how time has passed. This is my last Scroll article as President of the Congregation. And what an eventful two years it has been. During this time, we said Fare Well to Cantor Richard Walters at a Celebratory brunch in June 2018. We welcomed Cantor Rebecca Apt as our new Cantor. In less than a year, Cantor Apt has become part of the fabric of Beth Shalom. She led services this past High Holidays, she teaches music at the Religious School and inspires our children with song, and she was a supercalifragilistic Mary Poppins for Purim.

We broke ground on our new addition in July 2018. Despite weather delays, the four new classrooms opened for business before Thanksgiving. With large closets that allow us to store chairs and tables that once sat in Classroom E, the new rooms also serve the Religious School, Adult Education, and as social space. There are still some small things to be done - window treatments, shelving in the closets, some finishings and furnishings. We look forward to a formal dedication of the space in the fall.

We mourned for the victims of the Tree of Life congregation, brutally shot down in Pittsburgh, and we came together at Beth Shalom as both a Jewish and Interfaith community for a Memorial Vigil. Beth Shalom again participated in the interfaith Courageous Conversations. Our Teen Interfaith Initiative entered its third year. In the wake of violence against Black churches, synagogues, and mosques, these Interfaith dialogues are increasingly important. This year's Holocaust Remembrance, held here at Beth Shalom, involves a much larger community this year, with partners from many congregations, Jewish and non-Jewish, and the Howard

County Public Schools. In times of division, it is imperative that we come together.

And during my two years, life went on as usual at Beth Shalom. We welcomed new babies, congratulated newly-weds, and celebrated bnai mitzvah and confirmation graduates.

We were saddened by the loss of well-loved longtime members of our Congregation. Our Religious School flourished under the leadership of Dr. Louis Nagel. We came together for High Holiday, festival, and Shabbat services. The purpose and mission of Beth Shalom continued to be that of a welcoming, open, Jewish community.

But even as I step down and hand my Board Book and gavel to a new president, the Beth Shalom family is preparing for a momentous event. On July 16, 2020, our congregation will turn 50! There's a past to recall and a future to plan. I hope to be involved in that planning, and I invite everyone with a Beth Shalom story to tell or vision to promote to come forward and join in planning a 50th celebration.

And last, I want to thank the members of the Board of Trustees for their passion and commitment to Beth Shalom. And to especially express my gratitude to the Officers I have served with: Tammy Lawrence, Executive Vice President, Eric Gorny, First Vice President, Sherri Kersey, Second Vice President, Jill Oletsky, Secretary, and Susan Kuning, Treasurer. Their guidance and good sense have been invaluable. And a thank you to Rabbi Grossman for her unwavering support of the congregation, the Board, and personally, of me.

Beth Shalom 2019 Spring curriculum continues with a wide range of exciting and stimulating classes, speakers, and activities!

Our exciting Shabbat programming includes:

- **May 17th - Combating Extremism in Israel: Modern Voices:** Dr. Michal Cohen, who received her Ph.D. in Hebrew Literature from Bar-Ilan University in 2017 will be leading a discussion with Rabbi Grossman on “Masorti and Conservative - Natural Alliance”. Vatikim Dinner for mature singles, adults proceed services on these evenings.
- **June 1 - Torah Talks:** Join Rabbi Amy Scheinerman, author of the new 2 volume work, *The Talmud of Relationships*, for an engaging discussion on the how the weekly Torah reading can inform how we live our lives. Discussions take place during Sabbath services that begin at 9:30 am.
- **June 21 - Ask the Rabbi:** Bring your questions about any aspect of Jewish belief, custom, history, tradition, and current events for a spirited discussion with Rabbi Grossman during Friday evening services that begin at 8 pm.

Sunday, May 5, 7:30 pm: Yom Ha'atzmaut Movie: *Disengagement*. Let's celebrate Israeli Independence Day with our annual movie. In the wake of their father's death, Ana (Juliette Binoche) and her brother Uli are reunited in France. When Uli reveals that he will be traveling to Gaza to evacuate Israeli settlers, Ana insists on joining him to search for her long-lost daughter. Directed by Israeli director Amos Gitai, this movie was described as “..nothing short of brilliant” by Variety magazine. After watching the movie, join in a discussion of the movie, facilitated by Rabbi Grossman. Snacks provided!

Beth Shalom's Jewish Author Series continues in Spring 2019. Our next speaker, on **Sunday, May 19 at 7:30 pm**, is **Rabbi Amy Scheinerman**, author of *The Talmud of Relationships*. Rabbi Amy Scheinerman is the hospice rabbi in Howard County, Maryland. She serves on the Responsa Committee of the CCAR and as editor of the Torah Commentary column of the CCAR newsletter. In addition, she is the past president of both the Baltimore Board of the Rabbis and the Howard County Board of Rabbis. She has served Conservative, Reform, and unaffiliated congregations. **Separate Registration** for this event is required

Monday May 13 and Monday 20 at 7:30-9:00: Two Novels by Yochi Brandes: *The Secret Book of Kings* and *The Orchard*. Dr. Michal Cohen will discuss these two novels by Yochi (Yocheved) Brandes, who grew up in a Hassidic family, earned a BA in Biblical Studies and an MA in Judaic Studies and has taught Bible and Judaism. Her writing is rooted in her upbringing and her education, but she created

new and bold interpretations of well-known Biblical and Rabbinic narratives. *The Secret Book of Kings* offers a counter-narrative of the biblical events depicted in the books of Samuel and Kings, from the perspective of the descendants of the House of Saul. *The Orchard* offers a retelling of the life of Rabbi Akiva from the perspective of his wife Rachel. The two sessions will compare each novel to its Biblical or Rabbinic origins and will also compare the extent of deviation and subversion of the original narratives. Copies of the excerpts discussed will be provided. Dr. Cohen received her Ph.D. in Hebrew Literature from Bar-Ilan University in 2017. She currently works as a seminar paper advisor at Open University in Israel. Registration for this class is required.

Conversational Hebrew continues on Wednesdays at 7:45 through May 15. This class, with emphasis on grammar, conversational Hebrew, and vocabulary acquisition, is led by master teacher and native Israeli Ora Fisch. This class continues previous classes, but newcomers are welcome. **Saturday, June 8th, 7:00 pm: Tikkun Leil Shavuot.** A Shavuot tradition is to stay up all night and study. At Beth Shalom, our evening of learning ends a lot earlier! You'll have a choice of exciting workshops on a variety of subjects. Afterwards, enjoy delicious refreshments, including cheesecake and ice cream. Services will be held after the workshops. Watch your e-mail shortly for detailed program descriptions.

Friday-Saturday, June 14-15: Scholar in Residence Shabbat: The Ideal and the Real: How to Support Israel and Work to Change It. with Rabbi Martin Pasternak. As National Director of Synagogue and Rabbinic Activities for the Development Corporation for Israel, Rabbi Pasternak worked with Rabbi Grossman this past fall to develop the “It's Your Choice Campaign” to encourage Israel Bond donations designed to combat extremism in Israel by strengthening our pluralistic Masorti (Conservative) Movement there. Rabbi Pasternak will explore the changing political landscape of Israel following recent elections and discuss how support for the State of Israel can create traction to combat the growing influence of extremists in Israel.

All talks take place during Friday evening and Saturday morning services. Light refreshments provided following services. This weekend is part of the Beth Shalom Adult Education series: Combating Extremism in Israel. Rabbi Pasternak's visit is sponsored by Israel Bonds.

The Beth Shalom Religious School is exceptional. We have many elements to our program that could serve as models of Jewish education. I am energized by the children's enthusiasm in our minyanim. The involvement of Rabbi Grossman and Cantor Apt in the life of the school would be the envy of almost any synagogue school

community. Our creative arts programs provide alternative learning experiences. Events like Hanukkah Extravaganza, Havdallah Happening, and the upcoming (3rd-5th grades) Kabbalat Shabbat are milestones celebrating student achievement and are exemplars of the PBL (project based learning) approach to education. Collaborations with committees such as Adult Education and Social Action are also sources of strength. This statement is informed by my appreciation for the time it took to build such a program, the predecessors who put so much in place before the start of my tenure, and the synagogue leadership that supported an educational vision and provided the means to achieve success.

One of the aspects of our Religious School program that I immediately recognized and appreciated was the range of family education programs. At every grade level there is at least one formal activity that brings children and parents into the learning environment. From its inception, Jewish family education put to the lie the Biblical verse, "There is nothing new under the sun" (Kohelet 1:9). When this construct started to get attention it was a radically new innovation. It was based

on the idea that the Jewish home is the foundation on which the transmission, teaching and renewal of tradition ultimately happens. An early pioneer of this framework identified goals as "educate, strengthen and bind Jewish families.... helping each member participate more fully and find more meaning in his or her Judaism." It is also an opportunity to build community.

There are a multitude of structures for these programs, some a hybrid of adult learning and parent-child experiences and others exclusively parent-child engagement. I have gotten an abundance of feedback following sessions presented over the past few years, most of it reinforcing my approach and some thoughtful suggestions to improve these offerings. As I plan the schedule for the 2019-2020 school year, I am reflecting on improving the process. I look forward to your participation in these opportunities in the months ahead and for the upcoming school year to build community, strengthen family, and fulfill the Torah's vision, "Gather the people... let them hear My words... and may so teach their children" (Devarim 4:10).

In closing, I want to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for our outstanding teachers and madrichim. We are blessed to have such a dedicated faculty. The Religious School Committee has also continued to be a source of strength and also a model of leadership beyond compare. The school has also benefitted significantly from the support of the Board of Trustees, Sisterhood and Men's Club.

Two of the rooms open into a large, multipurpose space that are perfect for dinners and social events.
